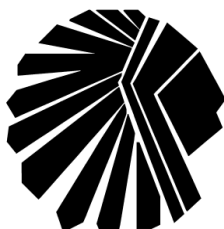

The Community

Pataskala is located in western Licking County, approximately twenty miles east of Columbus, Ohio.

The School

Watkins Memorial High School's 2021-2022 enrollment is 1,400. The school houses grades nine through twelve. The school's academic day consists of eight periods. Courses which award one credit meet five periods each week for a year, and courses which award one-half credit meet five periods each week for one semester. Exceptions are: physical education, weight lifting & conditioning, and adaptive P.E. which meet five periods each week for one semester for one-fourth credit.

Diploma Requirements

Students are offered vocational, general, college preparatory and honors courses. Students who wish to take a vocational program may attend the Licking County Career & Technology Education Center in Newark their junior and senior years. Students who wish to take advanced college preparatory courses may enroll in AP Literature and Composition, AP Language and Composition, AP Calculus (AB), AP Statistics, AP Physics, AP Computer Science A, AP Computer Science Principles, AP US History, or AP Government. Students may also earn college credit either through dual enrollment courses in English Composition 1 & 2, US Literature 1 & 2, Anatomy/Physiology 1 & 2, General Chemistry 1 & 2, Physics 1 & 2 and Intro Digital Photography or by enrolling in college courses through our College Credit Plus Program.

To fulfill the graduation requirements at Watkins Memorial High School, a student must earn twenty-one credits, including: four credits of English, three credits of social studies (including one credit of American history, one credit of world history and one credit of American government), four credits of math, three credits of science (including one life and one physical), one-half credit of health, one-half credit of physical education, and one credit of fine arts.

Rank

Rank is computed at the end of each semester. All subjects are counted.

Student Activities

Student activities include: Yearbook, Marching Band, Symphonic Band, Jazz Band, Choir, In The Know Team, Quiz Bowl, Drama Productions, Student Council, Ski Club, Varsity and Junior Varsity Sports, Drug Free Club, Fellowship of Christian Athletics and National Honor Society.
